TRAINING

As a part of the Alabama Master Gardener Program, you will receive instruction in many aspects of plant and soil science, horticulture, and horticultural pest control. Classes will consist of approximately 40 hours of instruction taught by Extension specialists, Extension agents, veteran Master Gardeners, and other horticulture experts.

VOLUNTEERING

Master Gardeners conduct plant clinics, speak to local groups and clubs, develop community gardening projects, answer gardening questions from telephone calls to the local Extension office, and much more. You will be given the opportunity to serve in the areas of your greatest interest and experience.
