

Year 'Round Fragrance - *a fragrant plant for every month* *Hayes Jackson, Urban Regional Extension Agent*

January~ Winter Honeysuckle (*Lonicera fragrantissima*) a deciduous shrub that does best with some alkaline soil.

February~Winter Daphne (*Daphne odora*), an evergreen shrub that needs good drainage and part sun.

March~ Hyacinthus (*Hyacinthus* hybrids), a popular late winter bulb in many colors.

April~ banana-shrub (*Michelia figo*), large evergreen shrub that is related to the southern magnolia.

May~ Confederate Jasmine (*Trachelospermum jasminoides*) a vine with white or yellow blooms.

June~ Gardenia (*Gardenia jasminoides*), a southern classic, try a variety called four seasons or frostproof for smaller areas

July~ Casa Blanca Lily (*Lilium 'Casa Blanca*), my favorite perennial lily, white in color.

August~ Ginger Lily (*Hedychium coronarium*), white orchid-like blooms, a perennial that needs dividing every few years.

September~ Night Blooming Jasmine (*Jasminum nocturnum*), a tropical or tender perennial in mild winters.

October~ Eleagnus (*Eleagnus ebbibgei*), a tough evergreen that has orchid scented blooms.

November~ Daydream Camellia (*Camellia sasanqua 'Daydream'*), a fragrant fall-blooming camellia, white with pink edge.

December~ Rjinvels Dafodil (*Narcissus 'Rjinveld's Early Sensation'*) the earliest dafodil to bloom.
