What is 4-H?

4-H offers learning-by-doing educational programs that help young people learn to make decisions, think critically, build relationships, practice leadership, and develop a concern for their community and their world. 4-H is offered as part of the youth development and education programs of the Lauderdale County office of the Alabama Cooperative Extension System.

In the schools, 4-H ...

... **meets monthly** in 4th, 5th, and 6th grade classrooms (Oct, Nov, Jan, Feb, Mar).

... **presents programs** on character, health, agriculture, life skills and more.

... **offers optional projects** and competitions to help students develop life skills.

... offers a **4-H Club for 7th - 12th grade** students during the school's club period.

In the community, 4-H ...

... has **monthly leadership meetings** that give youth the opportunity to do community service projects and programs.

... has a **monthly competitive event** that challenges youth to develop or improve their skill-level in a variety of activities.

... offers **special interest programs** designed to meet the interests of today's youth. These programs are often led by volunteers and meet around the county once a month.
