The Alabama 4-H Achievement Awards identifies outstanding Alabama 4-H members who have excelled in their 4-H career. Applications are judged by a screening committee of Extension professionals, 4-H Volunteers, and appropriate industry representatives. Interviews for the awards were held at the Alabama 4-H Center April 26, 2008.

Anna Leigh Peek, a six-year 4-H member in Limestone County, won the Poultry and Egg Science Award sponsored by the Alabama Poultry and Egg Association. Her Chef 4-H demonstrations included the three different grade of eggs, how to safely prepare egg dishes, and egg dish preparation. She has competed in the National Poultry and Egg Conference in Louisville Ky., as well as in state, regional, and county 4-H competitions.

Achievement Applications show the essential elements of 4-H -- belonging, independence, generosity and mastery. It also shows the dedicated efforts of 4-H members working to fulfill the 4-H motto, "To Make the Best Better."
