The Jeanette Sirten Memorial Scholarship was established in honor of Jeanette Sirten who was a devoted volunteer 4-H leader in Limestone County. She had a passion for 4-H and served not only the 4-H members of Limestone County, but also the community. She died suddenly at a young age and funds were collected to provide a scholarship to honor a graduating high school senior who has a strong 4-H record.

The 2011 Jeanette Sirten 4-H Memorial Scholarship is awarded to Lacy Lannom, a graduating senior at Ardmore High School. She has been active in 4-H since fifth grade. She has been exceptionally active in 4-H community service projects with the Ardmore High School 4-H club and the County 4-H Junior Leader's club. She has held leadership positions in the 4-H Junior Leaders Club as Treasurer, Secretary, and President for two years. She has also served as President of the Ardmore High School 4-H club for three years. Through all her 4-H years, she has truly pledged her head, heart, hands, and health for her club, community, country and world.

The \$500.00 scholarship will assist Lacy with her studies at the University of Alabama this fall. Lacy is the daughter of James and Sherry Lannom.
