RULES and REGULATIONS:

- The theme for this contest is **4-H CENTENNIAL: CELEBRATING 100 YEARS!**
- Each contestant will make a poster 14"X22" about the history, present status, and the future of the 4-H program.
- Contestants will learn/explain about the great contributions of the past 100 years that the Alabama 4-H program has provided through education.
- Use material from archives, county extension offices, internet, etc., or any other appropriate source.
- Do NOT use popular cartoon characters or other symbols under copyright protection.
- The contestant's name, club/school, and county must be on the back of each poster.
- Each contestant must bring their completed poster to the designated club meeting in order to receive recognition.

JUDGING:

- The county 4-H Agent Assistant will arrange for all county entries to be judged and for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place county posters to be selected.
- Judges will judge and score posters on a total of 100 points:

A. Information:

1. Follows Theme 20
2. Clarity of Message 20
3. Accuracy of Information.....20
4. Educational Focus10

B. Design:

1. Originality 10
2. Attractiveness and Neatness 20

AWARDS:

- The 1st, 2nd and 3rd place county posters in each age division will receive an award.
- The 1st place poster in each age division will be entered in the State Contest.
- State winners for each age division will be honored. State Level Contest Winners receive an award to display art work with engraving.
