Alabama 4-H Information for Staff and Volunteers and Youth

Alabama 4-H Dress Philosophy Statement and General Guidelines

Responsibility for grooming and appearance of each 4-H participant rests with the individual 4-H'er, parents and volunteers, and Extension staff. It is the philosophy of the Alabama 4-H & Youth Development Program that proper dress and good grooming contribute to good citizenship.

It is the Alabama 4-H & Youth Development Program's responsibility to ensure that participants' appearance does not jeopardize individual health and safety, nor that of others, and does not interfere or create disruptions during 4-H activities and events. To ensure that health standards, safety conditions, and proper educational process are maintained, the following grooming guidelines apply to all state 4-H activities and events:

- Clothing must be neat and clean in appearance.
- Vulgar or obscene patches, medallions, or insignia that may be offensive will not be worn. No signs, slogans, or pictures advertising alcohol, illicit drugs, tobacco products or depicting blood, gore, violence, or sex may be worn.
- Backless tops, see-through shirts or blouses, spaghetti straps (straps of less than one inch), cut-off clothes, strapless tops or dresses (exception is for evening dress where appropriate), plunging necklines, oversize arm holes, and clothing exposing the midriff are unacceptable.
- Tank tops on young men must measure at least three inches from collar to seam and sleeveless tops for young ladies must have straps measuring at least one inch.
- Shorts, skirts, and dresses must reach mid-thigh.
- It is usually improper to wear hoods, caps, hats, and sun visors inside buildings. None may ever be worn during meals, flag-raisings, pledges or during any time where respect is required.
- For young men, pants must be waist high with a belt if needed -- No sagging pants.
- Young ladies wearing hip-hugger/low slung pants or shorts must wear a top to cover the midriff.
- No portion of any undergarment should be visible at any time.
- All 4-H'ers must wear shoes.

These are general guidelines that should be observed at all state 4-H activities and events. Other guidelines for specific events may be issued if warranted.
