The Rules!

The basics are pretty simple:

- Your work must be original. Do not use copyrighted images.
- Project should be no larger than 3 ft x 3 ft x 3 ft.
- Project must be completed during the current 4-H club year.
- Any entry other than lego building, birdhouse designs, or quilt projects can be entered.

The Guidelines!

Following these suggestions will give you a better project:

- Think about the design elements or art principles used in your exhibit and how it is used. Design elements are color, line, texture, shape, and space. Art principles are rhythm, balance, proportion, emphasis, and unity.
- Design should be original and unique to you. By using one medium or a combination, a 4-H'er creates an object that is not recognizable as another's work.

Projects will be judged on learning involved, general appearance & design, and workmanship & techniques.
