Making 4-H Summer Camp Plans

Summer is fast approaching and many parents are making plans to fill their children's days. Summer camp is a popular choice. Parents from across the state will soon be able to enroll their children in summer camp sessions at the Alabama 4-H Center in Columbiana. Open enrollment begins February 22nd.

The 4-H Summer Camp program offers young people 9 and older a variety of activities during a three-day, two-night session. Activities include archery, canoeing, hiking, wildlife programs and arts and crafts. Tuition for camp is \$85 and includes lodging and meals. There are six camp sessions this year:

- Session 5, June 16-18
- Session 6, June 18-20

“Summer Camp at the Alabama 4-H Center is a great experience,” says Nancy Graves, a regional 4-H Extension agent working in Blount, Etowah and St. Clair Counties. “Youth get here and spend three jam-packed days. Many are not ready to go home at the end of their camp session.”
