

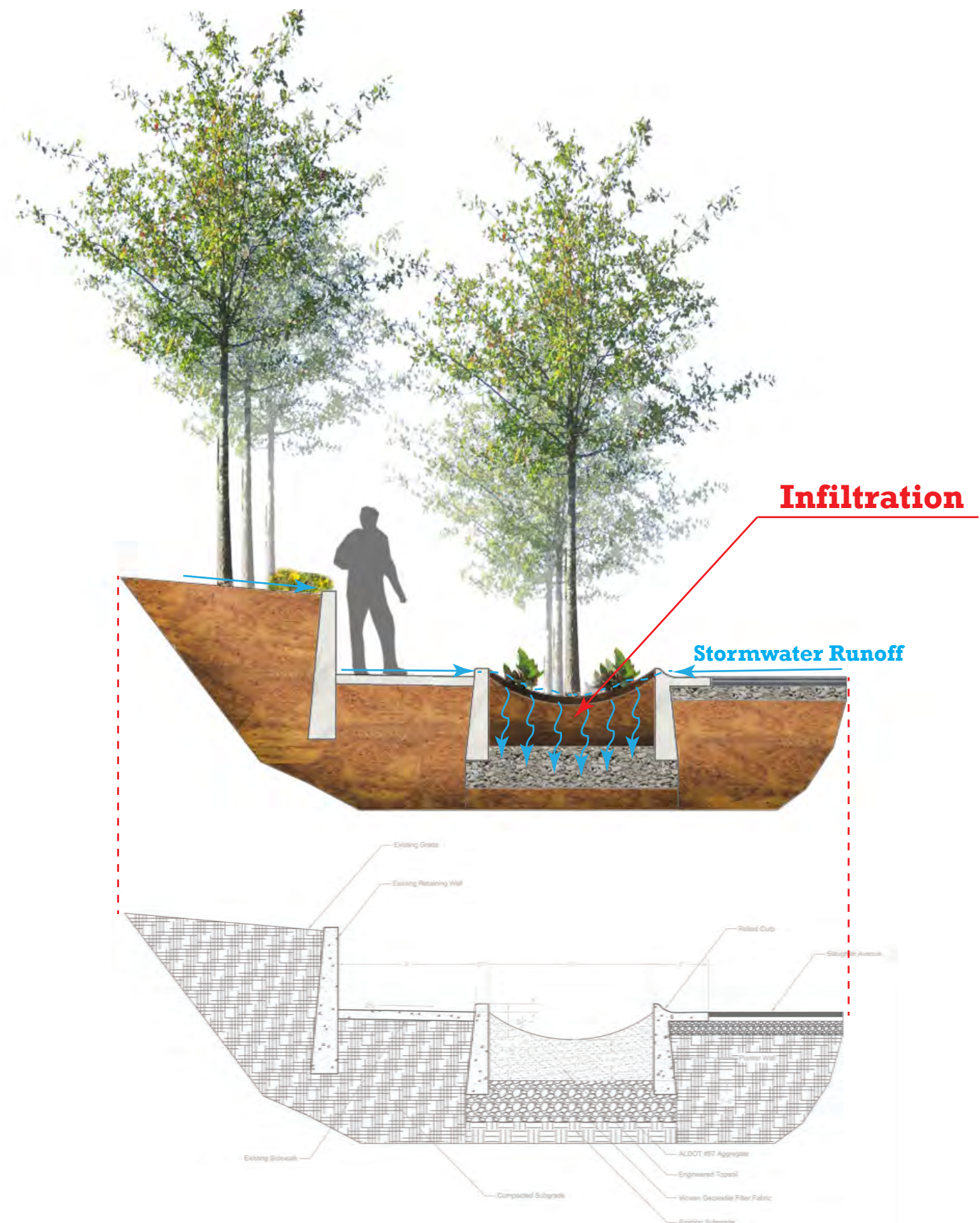
CITY OF AUBURN GREEN STREETS DEMONSTRATION PROJECT



Moton Stormwater Planter

- Removes Harmful Pollutants from Urban Stormwater Runoff
- Reduces Urban Impacts on Local Streams, Wetlands, and Lakes
- Provides Improved Aesthetic Appeal

Project Overview - In an effort to reduce the impacts of stormwater pollution in the Saugahatchee Creek Watershed, the Watershed Division of the City of Auburn, Alabama teamed up with the Saugahatchee Watershed Management Plan (SWaMP) to construct Auburn's first "Green Streets" facility. By encouraging stormwater to infiltrate into the ground, this stormwater planter mimics natural hydrologic processes and keeps harmful pollutants from entering Saugahatchee Creek, a State 303(d)-listed impaired waterbody. Additionally, incorporating this facility into the Moton Housing Renovation provides for a subsequent enhancement of the surrounding landscape.
