

Creative Outreach

This project will involve the use of various creative abilities to express the problem of hunger and poverty in the region in which they are situated. Students should work together in groups no larger than 4 and if necessary in pairs of 2 to decide on a creative outlet which best suits their abilities to address the problems in their community. This may involve taking photographs in impoverished areas; clipping articles from regional magazines or newspapers and assembling them into a notebook or poster presentation; using artistic abilities of their own, such as painting, drawing or sewing to express their own feelings about the problem of hunger and poverty; or writing a poem or short story to express their encounters with the problem.

Display projects at school or a community center.

Have a competition; ask local businesses to donate the prizes
