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What You Will Learn

- The Quilting Project will help you learn about art and cloth.
- The Quilting Project will help you learn to make choices.

The Rules

- You can't use a kit or fabric packet.
- Quilts shouldn't be much bigger than 3 feet by 3 feet, but can be smaller when entering in the junior division.
- Quilts can be any shape.
- Quilts can be wearable (like a vest or skirt), wall quilts, placemats, pillows, baby quilts or any other form.
- Construction and quilting may be done by hand or machine or even glued.
- Put your name or names and county on the back. You can do this by pinning on a slip of paper.
- All work must be done by one 4-H member or several 4-Hers working together.
- Adults can show you how, but shouldn't do the work for you – that wouldn't be fair!
- Team and individual quilts are judged all together.

Quilts will be judged on skill, imagination, and overall appearance.
