### The Rules

- Stories may be told individually or by two people telling a story in tandem. Teams and individuals will be judged in the same event.
- Stories should be 2 to 4 minutes for individuals and 4 to 6 minutes for two people.
- Your story must be told without notes.
- You may use simple props which do not distract from your story.
- Your story should be something you learned to tell this year.
- Try to tell a story that has not been used in 4-H before.
- Costumes are acceptable, but are not required.
- Your story may come directly from a book or another source or it may be adapted or your own original story.
