ELEMENTARY	MIDDLE		Action Tree: This activity uses the image of a tree to help students understand the problem of hunger and actions that can be taken to reduce hunger in their communities, as well as more globally.
ELEMENTARY	MIDDLE	HIGH	Global Wealth: The activity is designed to show student hunger facts in a concrete way. The questions are there to help the students reflect on what they are seeing. The idea is not to make the largest group feel guilty or the students feel guilty for what they have in real life. It is to open their eyes and get them thinking.
	MIDDLE	HIGH	Human Dignity: Introduce students to human dignity and the United Nations' Universal Declaration of Human Rights.
ELEMENTARY	MIDDLE	HIGH	Hunger Awareness Garden: Students create a garden with informational posters and signs. This educational activity can be developed into a community service project (see "Gardening Project" in the Community Service section.
ELEMENTARY	MIDDLE	HIGH	Hunger Cookbook: For this activity get your students to pick a country and to find several recipes. Along with finding recipes, students should also research the issues related to hunger that are affecting their country (eg.: war, famine, drought, unemployment, etc.)
ELEMENTARY	MIDDLE	HIGH	Hunger Crossword Puzzle: This crossword puzzle is intended to teach students about some of the basics of hunger and the resources that are available to help people that are in need.
	MIDDLE	HIGH	Hunger Jeopardy: This is an interactive Power Point. It is a multiple choice version of "Hunger Jeopardy" (complete with sound).
ELEMENTARY	MIDDLE	HIGH	Hunger Obstacle Course: This has participants engage in creative problem solving through a time-limited process of generating solutions to different hunger-related problems.
	MIDDLE	HIGH	Hunger Skit: Build student conceptions of what it means for a person to be victimized by inequality and remain a victim even after the issue has come to the attention of others.
ELEMENTARY	MIDDLE		Hunger Wall: One or more groups create a ceramic wall of hunger that displays facts and images of hunger as a means to educate others about this social problem.

	MIDDLE	HIGH	<u>Nutrition on a Mission:</u> Helps students realize how hard it is for families in poverty and on food stamps to shop for food and stay on a budget. This activity is also designed to help students know how to eat healthy on a budget.
	MIDDLE	HIGH	<u>Practicing Empathy:</u> This helps students to literally understand what it is like for an elderly person to walk to the grocery store.
ELEMENTARY	MIDDLE		<u>Three Worlds:</u> This "physical" activity helps students appreciate the privileges they have as part of a first world country. It also can be used to educate students about diversity of privilege that exists within the state of Alabama.
	MIDDLE	HIGH	<u>Tower of Hunger:</u> This Tower of Hunger is a game that will help students realize the many reasons and solutions for world hunger.
	MIDDLE	HIGH	<u>Web of Connections:</u> This game introduce participants to the interrelated nature of social problems on a global scale.
ELEMENTARY	MIDDLE	HIGH	<u>Wheel of Hunger:</u> Played like <i>Wheel of Fortune</i> , this activity helps students learn about local and national programs that help to fight hunger.
ELEMENTARY	MIDDLE	HIGH	<u>Word Search:</u> This word search is intended to teach children some very basic ideas about hunger and how they are helping with this problem.
