Join us for “Introduction to Stream Restoration Using Natural Channel Design” workshop held at the Auburn University Hotel and Dixon Conference Center in Auburn, Alabama May 4 – 6, 2004.

This 2 ½ day workshop will introduce basics concepts of stream restoration using natural channel design. Time will be split between classroom and extensive field work, including project / data summaries and evening work sessions. Classroom work will review natural channel design principles, restoration case studies, and the Rosgen classification system. Field techniques for stream condition assessment and the Rosgen classification system will be covered in detail.

The workshop will center on Parkerson Mill Creek, a degraded urban stream on Auburn University’s campus. Greg Jennings, Ph.D., of North Carolina State University will emphasize urban stream conditions specific to the southeastern U.S. Workshop instructors have experience working on more than 40 stream assessments and restoration projects throughout the Southeast. Each participant will receive a reference manual.
