Join us for “Introduction to Stream Restoration Using Natural Channel Design” workshop held at the Birmingham Botanical Gardens in Birmingham, Alabama September 7-9, 2004.

This 2 ½ day workshop will introduce basics concepts of stream restoration using natural channel design. Time will be split between classroom and extensive field work, including project / data summaries and evening work sessions. Classroom work will review natural channel design principles, restoration case studies, and the Rosgen classification system. Field techniques for stream condition assessment and the Rosgen classification system will be covered in detail.

The workshop will center on a degraded urban stream on the grounds of the Birmingham Botanical Gardens. Greg Jennings, Ph.D., PE of North Carolina State University will emphasize urban stream conditions specific to the southeastern U.S. Workshop instructors have experience working on more than 40 stream assessments and restoration projects throughout the Southeast. Each participant will receive a reference manual.
