Join us for “Introduction to Stream Restoration Using Natural Channel Design” workshop at the East Room, Birmingham Botanical Gardens in Birmingham, Alabama June 28-29, 2007. Registration is 8:30-9 am CT on June 28.

This 2-day workshop will introduce basics concepts of stream restoration using natural channel design. Time will be split between classroom and extensive field work, including project / data summaries and evening work sessions. Classroom work will review natural channel design principles, restoration case studies, and the Rosgen classification system. Field techniques for stream condition assessment and the Rosgen classification system will be covered in detail.

The workshop will discuss agricultural and urban stream conditions specific to the southeastern U.S. Greg Jennings, Ph.D., PE of North Carolina State University will emphasize basic concepts and lessons learned. Workshop instructors have experience working on more than 50 stream assessments and restoration projects throughout the Southeast. Each participant will receive a reference manual.
