

The Alabama 4-H Grows Garden Project offers four tiers, or levels, that provide young people with handson gardening experiences. Tiers I, II, III, and IV are currently available to all youth. Register in 4HOnline or with your county Extension office.

Tier I is a novice gardening project. It addresses having limited access to gardening space, such as living in an apartment or an urban setting. Youth enrolled in the tier I project will grow three Bonnie Plants (broccoli, collard, and white hybrid cauliflower) or comparable plants in 5-gallon buckets or similar sized containers while keeping a gardening journal.
