

Making Alabama Breastfeeding Friendly

The Breastfeeding Friendly Child Care Certification program is a collaborative effort of Alabama Extension, the Alabama Department of Public Health, the Alabama Partnership for Children, and the Alabama Breastfeeding Committee, In 2022, agents certified 52 Alabama providers serving more than 1,800 children. Participation in this program resulted in 260 improved practices among participating early child care providers. An interactive map identifying certified breastfeeding friendly providers is available for parents or caregivers seeking this option in their county or community. In 2018, Alabama adopted the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) high school graduation policy to support the governor's workforce goals and FAST: Financial Aid Survival Toolkit (ALFAST), the first statewide Extension curriculum designed to increase FAFSA awareness and decision-making, reached 10,000 Alabama high school seniors and 33 school counselors

10K High school seniors reached

90.7% Students completing the ALFAST post-workshop survey made an intentional decision about FAFSA. including exploring post-secondary two- and four-year colleges and universities, certification, and licensure.
