## **Privacy and Security**

As more people use the Internet, it is important to protect your personal data. Discover methods used to obtain personal data for illegal activity and methods you can use to avoid these scams.

## **Smart Devices**

Smart devices are electronic tools that can connect, share information, and interact with users and other devices. This class provides an overview of smart devices and their capabilities.

## **Social Media and Gaming**

Social media platforms allow people to create and share information in virtual communities and networks. Gaming involves playing online games alone or with other players. While both can be fun, everyone needs to know how to use these resources with minimal risks.
